Display boards are set up with focus on values building, especially on 'Care and Communion'.</li> <li>2. Selected articles on 'Care and Communion' by the Teacher Librarian for display and follow-up activities.</li> <li>3. Short talks on 'Care and Communion' will be shared during assemblies.</li> <li>4. More than 70% of teachers agree that programmes on whole person development of students are effective.</li> <li>2. More than 400 entries were received from the slogan competition, and the slogans reflected that students were creative and they were ready to show their ideas of 'Care and Communion' to others. Selected slogans were printed on plastic file holders which were distributed to students. Students had a chance to see the works of their schoolmates. Small gifts were also given to students for their good work.</li> <li>2. Reading materials on 'Care and Communion' were posted on display boards at the school lobby. It is proposed to place the displays at corridors to attract more students' attention the next school year.</li> <li>3. We had successfully instilled positive values in students and would focus on other important core values next year.</li> <li>4. 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<p>To reinforce proper behaviour among students.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Teachers who are responsible for supervising students at the school playground will also continue to perform supervision duties at the rear and front staircases so as to ensure better behaviour among students when going up to classrooms.</li> <li>2. First Assemblies will be extended to all Junior Secondary students and not just S1 students at the beginning of the school year in order to build up a closer relationship with students.</li> <li>3. An inter-class discipline competition will be held in the second term.</li> <li>4. When going to classrooms during rainy days, students will be instructed to proceed and line up properly outside classrooms waiting for their teachers, and thereby reinforcing their proper behavior and responsibility.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. More than 70% of teachers agree that students' overall performance in class and assemblies has improved.</li> <li>2. The inter-class discipline competition has been successfully run.</li> <li>3. Teachers' observation.</li> <li>4. Students' reflection.</li> <li>5. Students keep on behaving properly even on rainy days, and be well disciplined when waiting outside class rooms without the supervisions of class teachers.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. First Assemblies for all the S1 -S3 classes were held at the beginning of the school year to build up a closer relationship among students. In addition to explaining the importance of rules and discipline in the Centre to students, the Discipline Master and relevant teachers also delivered short talks on 'anti-drugs'. With the help of short videos, students were reminded to be cautious against drug abuse. Through the discipline team's interpretation, students were more alert not to fall into traps, as well as protecting themselves against drug temptation. Students also learnt the importance of self-respect. A much clearer definition and concept on 'self-worth' had been developed in their mind.</li> <li>2. No serious discipline cases occurred during the year. Discipline teacher-on-duty gave students appropriate counseling and guidance whenever and wherever needed. They provided prompt advice and guidance for students and offered support to teachers to create a better teaching and learning atmosphere in the classrooms. The display boards were attractive and the message of ‘Care and Communion’ had been brought out through short stories or articles displayed.</li> <li>2.
